

because I have so many people who have called, and as I say, the ones that I have visited with are reasonable people. It is just simply that they have feelings that perhaps I am trying to understand, and they are trying to understand me, and they are trying to understand the bill, so I would like to get them together in District 29 and have Brad Ashford come and visit with them one-on-one and let them ask questions, and let him ask questions, and so on, so we can come to a better understanding about it. I see no other way to do it right now, and I will vote for the bracket motion until May 8, 1991, and I think Senator Schellpeper had a little tongue in cheek there, because I suppose we wouldn't be here next May 8, 1992, right? Okay, so I will support the motion. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Crosby. Senator Schmit, on the motion to bracket. Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: I am just going to call the question, please.

SPEAKER BAACK: Do I see five hands? I do. We will now proceed to vote on ceasing debate. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Debate has ceased. Senator Ashford, to close on your motion to bracket.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. First of all, Senator Schellpeper, I am not sure this is what you meant, but I would suggest that we can learn from the people of the State of Nebraska about how they want to deal with this problem, and that it is informative and important to go outside of Lincoln, where the decisions are made, and learn from the people who are most affected by this legislation, learn their thoughts about how it should proceed. And I appreciate very much Senator Crosby giving me my first invitation to go out, at least to her district in Lincoln, here, and talk about LB 355 because there are significant misconceptions out there as to what 355 does do. One of the greatest misconceptions is that, again Senator Schellpeper talks about guns and giving guns, loaning guns, and transferring guns, and so forth, we are, again, talking only about handguns, and I think that sometimes gets, when we talk about gun control, people get confused. We are talking only about handguns, we are not talking about a bill that calls for
