So from my point of view, right now this is a futile argument about what we call it, and I am going to vote against it because I think it is an unborn child. It is a baby. It is a living human being. Can we not all agree on that just once and go ahead and talk about the things that we want to talk about to help that girl, that woman, that family, that child that is going to be born, and help the boy, that we keep leaving that young man out all the time? He has got a problem, too, out there. We are not helping our children. We desert them. When they need us the most, we desert them, because we simply will not put things in place that might give them an excuse to say, well, I don't want to tell my parents but the law says I have to. Or the aborting doctor doesn't want a parent involved, but when you put something in the law that says they have to tell them, then at least you do have a little spring up to help that young woman, and to help the boy who is suffering, too, to help the parents, and to keep that child. And then after she has the child, please take care of that child. I will vote against this amendment.
