SPEAKER BAACK PRESIDING

SPEAKER BAACK: (Mike not activated immediately.)
...Legislative Chamber. For the prayer this morning we have
Harland Johnson.

HARLAND JOHNSON: (Prayer offered.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Roll call.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: No corrections, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any messages, reports or announcements?

CLERK: Mr. President, Committee on Enrollment and Review
respectfully reports they have carefully examined and reviewed
LB 203 and recommend that same be placed on Select File; LB 203A
and LB 850. (See pages 1574-76 of the Legislative Journal.)

I have a reference report of a gubernatorial appointee. And,
Mr. President, a series of audit reports from the State Auditor.
Those will be on file in my office, available for legislator
review. That's all that I have, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: While the Legislature is in session and capable
of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 64.
We'll now proceed to Item 5 on the agenda, Final Reading. I
would remind my colleagues that you are to be in your seats so
we can begin Final Reading. Please take your seats so we can

CLERK: (Read LB 159 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER BAACK: All provisions of law relative to procedure
having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 159 pass?
All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record,
Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 1578-79 of the Legislative
Journal.) 40 ayes, 0 nays, 9 excused and not voting,
Mr. President.
