SENATOR LABEDZ: I'm sorry. It was Senator Lindsay's amendment and I'm going to take Senator Lindsay's amendment to the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Okay, Senator Labeledz. Mr. Clerk, do you have an amendment to the amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Labeledz would move to amend Senator Schimek's amendment. Would you like me to read it, Senator? Would that be helpful? On page 1 of the Schimek amendment, line 2, strike the work "notification" and insert the word "death". On line 3 strike the word "or" and insert the word "and", and in line 4, strike "minor" and insert "woman".

SENATOR LABEDZ: I'm sorry, Mr. President, Senator Lindsay is now in the Supreme Court and thought he would be back in time. It's very difficult for me to handle his amendment, but I did speak now to Senator Chambers and to Senator Schimek and we read the amendment as it would stand. The attending physician certifies in writing in the pregnant woman's medical record that continuation of the pregnancy provides an immediate threat and grave risk to the life or health of the pregnant woman and there is insufficient time to provide the required notification. I urge the adoption of Senator Lindsay's and Labeledz's amendment to the Schimek amendment.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Senator. Senator Crosby.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. Chairman, see, I know who is up there, Senator Conway. I'm sorry, Mr. Clerk, you'll just have to give me that...those words again, and then I wanted to say one thing.
