

is insufficient time to provide the required notification. I think it clears up the language. It more succinctly says what we mean to say and I think both sides can pretty much agree that what the amendment to the amendment does is clarify what the intent of the law is. And concern for threat or grave risk, concern for threat and grave risk, you know, perhaps can be seen as nit picking, but I think what it does is put us in compliance with the statutes as they currently exist and when adding the language there is insufficient time to provide the required notification goes back to the bill itself which the very essence of the bill is to provide notification and it addresses the concern that if there is not time for notification that indeed you can go ahead with the procedure, but only under those circumstances. And so I would support the amendment to the amendment and would encourage the rest of the body to do so. Thank you.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Senator. Senator Schimek, please.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, I would simply like to note for the body that Senator Chambers and I have read and reread the amendment to the amendment are supportive of it. With that, I would just suggest we vote on it.

ENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Senator. That was the final light. Excuse me, Senator Chambers' light just came on.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, not having had many opportunities, not having had any opportunities as far as I can recollect to be in accord with Senator Labeledz on one of these bills, I want to call attention to the fact that we are in accord on this one. However, however, that does not mean that the bill has reached a level which I think is satisfactory, but I had stated yesterday that a long journey such as this must be taken a step at the time, so maybe if I can compromise in this fashion and agree with Senator Labeledz, when we come to one of the other areas she may compromise with me and agree to kill the bill.
