

schools. So technically that is what Section 8 deals with at this time, not the way Section 8 deals...is dealt with in the green copy. So technically I don't think we need my amendment to the amendment, but to make sure that the body is comfortable with it, make sure the body is comfortable that we're talking simply public, I offer that clarification that will obviously be taken care of in the E & R and we can come back later at some other time if the amendment is offered and discuss whether or not all schools should be included rather than just public. That's the nature of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there discussion on the Bernard-Stevens amendment to the Will amendment? Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I rise in support of the Bernard-Stevens amendment to my amendment. My intent in offering this amendment was certainly to dovetail 100 percent with the Withem amendment that we adopted yesterday. As has been pointed out, that amendment applied to public schools only. This would...the Senator Bernard-Stevens amendment would make my amendment apply to public schools only. I certainly don't think that this is the appropriate time to open the debate on whether we want to include private schools under the umbrella of the Withem amendment. With that I would support Senator Bernard-Stevens' amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Will. Any other discussion on the amendment to the amendment offered by Senator Bernard-Stevens? Seeing none, do you wish to close, Senator Bernard-Stevens? He waives closing. We will now proceed to vote on the amendment to the amendment as offered by Bernard-Stevens. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Bernard-Stevens' amendment to the Will amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment to the amendment is adopted. Is there any other discussion on the amendment offered by Senator Will as it is now amended? Seeing none, Senator Will, do you wish to close?

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I just want to make a few points in closing on my amendment. Again, what the amendment would do is simply say that in any
