SPEAKER BAACK: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor of the house going under call vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under call. All members please report to the Chamber and record your presence, the house is under call. The house is under call. Please report to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. Senator Schrock, would you please record your presence. Senator Hall, would you please record your presence. CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1584 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President, on the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment fails. The next item on the bill, Mr. Clerk. The call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Labeledz would move to amend.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I believe that is the amendment to the...the previous amendment to the Lynch amendment?

CLERK: Yes.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you. I won't go into detail about the amendment. It is the intent language that will be at the beginning of LB 425. We've already adopted, which I've agreed to with Senator Lynch's amendment and the Chair at that point declared the Labeledz amendment as not germane to the Lynch amendment and, therefore, I'm offering it now as a separate amendment.
