

to take that into consideration that we need to be clear about the alternatives here and about the time frame. I still have a question about the time frame and how it's going to work in three days. I don't believe I can support the Lindsay amendment for much the same reason I don't...that Senator Landis mentioned. I don't think we really know what is an adequate or reasonable time frame here to write into this bill and his suggestion that we study it a little more, I think, is a good suggestion. Senator Landis, could you reiterate for me and maybe for the body the areas that you mentioned that we should look into? I caught three of them but I don't...I'm not sure I caught all of them.

SENATOR LANDIS: Sure. In fact, the areas that I think are right for ripe for discussion are the very claims about the judicial bypass system that the proponents of the bill make. They claim that it's confidential. I would like to see that it's confidential. They say that it's workable. I would like to see that it's workable. They say that there are opportunities for rural kids to use the bypass system by having courts available. I would like to see that happen. They say that there is an opportunity to get a judgment within a reasonable time. I would like to see that we have a system that does that. Those are representations that proponents make. And in the event I could see that in language and we work through those problems, it, I think, would foreclose a great deal of the kinds of harassment amendments that they might view that I might feel necessary to make because I can't see it in the bill now.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I think there are probably a few other areas that we could add to that list and I think Senator Bernard-Stevens may be addressing one of those areas in an amendment that has to do with counsel and how a young woman gets counsel and...

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...who pays for it. But there may be the...the list may be just a little bit longer than the one that you put together but I thank you for putting it together. I...I can't say too strongly that I think we have to remember who this bill is...to whom this bill is applying. It is the young woman and I don't believe we want to make this the most punitive measure that we can. I think we want to try to make it at least easy...the easiest possible bill if we're going to buy into this
