

the bill. In Judiciary, this year, we have bill...LB 814, this tells you how our perception of one side of the issue could change or change overnight. And I know that Senator Schmit, Senator Labedz, Senator Lynch, all of them in the Franklin case had real severe images in their mind or how severely the child and children are abused. And Senator Labedz or Senator Schmit would be one of the very first ones that would acknowledge that. I have LB 814, and in that it says a child...it's a child's rights. A child shall have the right to freedom of expression, including the right to seek, receive, impart information, ideas of all kinds, regardless of frontiers and so on. A child shall have the right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion. A child temporarily or permanently deprived of his or her family...

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR NELSON: ...environment, or in whose own best interest cannot be allowed to remain in that environment, shall be entitled to special protection assistance from the State of Nebraska. A child has the right of enjoyment of the highest attainable standards of health to facilities for the treatment and illness of rehabilitation of health. On and on, make primary education compulsory available and free to all children. I don't know how we can do it, if she's pregnant. A child has the right to a standard of living adequate for the child's physical, mental, spiritual, moral and social development. I won't go on down the line, because Senator Schmit and Senator Smith...Senator Labedz were very, very sincere when they signed on this bill. It's a terrible bill. There are a number of things in it that are not possible. The development of respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms are within this bill. And I could go on and on.
