SPEAKER BAACK: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 6 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Debate has ceased. Senator Labeledz, would you like to close on the advancement of LB 425.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Absolutely, Mr. Speaker. Thank you very much. Senator Nelson mentioned the fact that I was a co-sponsor of the civil rights bill for children. She's correct. I believe in the civil rights for children, and that's why I feel so strongly about LB 425, because I also believe in the rights of the unborn child. I do appreciate some of the things that Senator Chambers said, some time ago this afternoon, about the rights of women. And I also want to tell him that I appreciate the fact that he has fought for women the 15 years that I have been here, and I appreciate that fact. I only wish that I...the 15 years that I've been here, that I could convince him that the unborn child is just as important as a woman's rights. And very seldom on this floor do we speak of the rights of the unborn child. So I had to bring that up in my closing. I don't want anybody to leave the floor, so we'll still under call. And I will now move for the advancement of LB 425 to E & R initial. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: All members are now here, so we will proceed to vote on the advancement of LB 425. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We're voting on the advancement of LB 425. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 425.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 425 advances. Do you have items for the record, Mr. Clerk?
