

SENATOR LANDIS: And it's two types of attacks, one, I don't think they have the authority given to them, under this bill, to do that change. So I think you would have an injunction, a mandamus, a quo warranto, those kinds of attacks on the board's power. The second attack would be...

SPEAKER BAACK: Time.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...the State Board of Equalization, where they could reverse that kind of action by the county board.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Before we go to the next speaker, I would like to introduce some guests of Senator Moore. SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President and members. The committee amendments again...I probably will not support LB 320. I'll make those arguments after the committee amendments are adopted. But I would urge everyone to vote for the committee amendments again. I think that the issue that has been explained, probably better by others, is one that I guess it's a question of do you put the proposal in the proper form. I'll argue with the parcelization issue that Senator Lamb raises, and the whole issue of income as it relates to a constitutional question. But the committee amendments address those concerns to the best extent possible, and we've worked on this, up until we got an opinion on personal property, through virtually the entire length of time that we have had public hearings and until the advancement of this bill to the floor by the committee. The first proposal that we dealt with was 404, the freeze that took care of the assessors with regard to sending out the tax statements, and moved things along so that folks would know where we sit. LB 320 and the other proposals that Senator Kristensen and I brought in, that dealt with the market formula, straight percentage, were other options that were out there. They were all debated and they will still be debated yet this morning. But the committee amendments do put this proposal in the best form possible. Now there are folks who aren't going to like it that are going to be supportive of this bill. Senator
