CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. All members who are not excused please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Please check in. Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABOUD: Yes, Madam Chair, I would request a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Roll call vote has been requested. We are looking for...please check in, Senator Landis and Senator Lindsay. Senators Peterson and Schellpeper. Would the senators all please return to their seats. We are under call. We will now proceed with the roll call vote on the motion to overrule the Chair.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1634-35 of the Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, to overrule the Chair.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The Chair is sustained. We will raise the call and we will proceed with the next amendment. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, the next amendment to the bill is by Senator Kristensen.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam President. Mr. Clerk, is this the amendment on page 1619, AM1220?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you. Madam President and members, this is the amendment that Senator Beutler referred to that he was discussing last week. During that period of time we had the chance to examine that and redraft an amendment. You will find that amendment...this is dealing with active judges from the District Court that can serve in the case of incapacity or temporary vacancies on the court of appeals. This also goes towards retired judges for the same manner that we have for the Supreme Court. This language is lifted from another statute
