LB 240, 254, 254A, 648, 732A, 732, 782, 789

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. We will now vote on the motion to advance LB 732. We have had a request for a machine vote. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 11 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 732.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 732 is advanced. I would like to make some introductions now to the Legislature. Our doctor of the day who has been seated under the north balcony, is Dr. David Johnson. Please welcome Dr. Johnson. And also seated in the south balcony this morning are 46 high school students who are from across the world, and they are here from the E.F. Foundation in Lincoln, Nebraska, accompanied by their sponsor. Would you all please rise and be recognized. Welcome to the Legislative Chambers today. Now, while the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign the following legislative bills: LB 240, LB 254, LB 254A, LB 648, LB 782, and LB 789. We'll proceed with LB 732A.

CLERK: Madam President, no E & R amendments to LB 732A. However, Senator Kristensen would move to amend. The amendment is on page 1511 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. This is the amendment to the A bill. After we struck the number of judges down, this is the amendment that would reduce the cost of the court. There is roughly a million dollar price reduction, or just a little over that. With that, the amendment in full, really, is on page 1512, as it starts on 1511. With that, I would urge the adoption of this amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I'll wait for the A bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We are on the A bill. Oh, you want the bill itself. Okay. Anybody who wishes to speak to the Kristensen amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing? Closing is waived. Proceed to vote on the Kristensen amendment to LB 732A.
