SPEAKER BAACK: Time.

SENATOR SCHMIT: ...out much more of the fund than you will find on the small operator with the \$5,000 limitation. I ask you to support the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: You have heard Senator Schmit's closing on his amendment. We will now proceed to vote on that amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the Schmit amendment, have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I'm reluctant to do so but I would ask for a call of the house, please.

SPEAKER BAACK: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under call. All members please report to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. We need Senators Wesely, Will, and Labeledz. Senator Landis, would you record your presence, please. Senators Peterson and Chambers. We are looking for Senators Chambers, Wesely and Labeledz. Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I would accept call in votes.

SPEAKER BAACK: Call in votes have been authorized. Senator Rod Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Have a roll call, please.

SPEAKER BAACK: Roll call vote has been requested. We are awaiting the arrival of Senator Wesely. Senator Schmit, we cannot find Senator Wesely. Should we go ahead?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes, go ahead, please, Senator Baack.
