

amendment. It's taking the word "Technical" off, it's not adding it. So it's an untechnical amendment. With that, I would just urge the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR WARNER: Those in favor of adoption of the Baack amendment vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Baack.

SPEAKER BAACK: Yes, Mr. Chairman, I would, I think reluctantly, have to ask for a...well, no, we'll let it go.

SENATOR WARNER: Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR WARNER: The motion is carried and the amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Robinson would move to amend, Mr. President. (The Robinson amendment appears on page 1597 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, amendment 1147 is an amendment that would give some aid to the Indian Community College which has branches at Winnebago, Macy, and Santee. There has been a bill in the last two years that has passed that has given some aid to the Indian Community College but it was vetoed last year. So this bill would amend the amendment that would be placed in 663 in the amendments that Senator Moore placed on the bill, oh, a few days ago. Basically, what Senator Moore's bill was was a formula, a new formula for community colleges. And, basically, what the aid would be is that the...you take the aid for the northeast community college and take the average of the last three years FTE and divide it by the total aid that they received in '90-91 and you come out with the figure of \$1,040. And that would be taken times of the number of non-Native Americans that go to the Indian Community College. Basically, it would probably amount from 30 to \$35,000 after it was all taken care of. And, basically, this is what the bill does...or, excuse me, the amendment does, and the money would be channeled through the Northeast Community College at Norfolk. Now I would like to
