

Cross, Modular Housing Advisory Board, from Columbus; Gary Rickett, Modular Housing Advisory Board, from North Platte; Rod Thompkins, Modular Housing Advisory Board, from Wayne. Madam Chairman, I would move that these people all be confirmed.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. Is there anyone who wishes to speak to this confirmation report? Seeing none, we will vote on the adoption of the confirmation report. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the confirmation report? Have you all voted on the confirmation report? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of the confirmation report.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The report is adopted. We'll proceed with General File, LB 457.

CLERK: Madam President, 457 was a bill introduced by Senator Schellpeper. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 18, referred to the Judiciary Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Judiciary Committee.

PRESIDENT MOUL: I'll recognize Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you, Madam Speaker, or Madam Chairman, President, we never know what to call the members of the body when they're in the Chair, so I wanted to make sure we extended the same courtesy to the Lieutenant Governor. Am I going to get out of trouble? No. All right. What if we talk about the bill. All right. LB 457 is a bill requiring automatic wage withholding in IV-D child support cases. Senator Schellpeper will introduce the bill in the main later. The committee amendment, which is number 0670, is found at page 1136 of the Journal. The committee adopted the amendment as a result of testimony at the public hearing. The concerns were expressed that the bill went further than was currently required by federal law. The committee amendments add language emphasizing that LB 457's provisions apply to IV-D cases only, those are cases in which you have a recipient of ADC. The amendment also emphasizes the prospective application of the bill, in other words, it would not be applied retroactively. Another aspect of the amendment is that it provides for notice to the obligor, or the person who must pay child support, in the event withholding
