The other problem that I see in here, Senator Beutler, do we know what that percentage of variance is from the Supreme Court's guidelines? Is that 5 percent, is that a 10 percent variance? How much of a variance before you will get to a material change in circumstances?

SENATOR BEUTLER: At this point in time it is being left to the Supreme Court to define...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Do we have any idea even of what the ballpark figure may be?

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, I don't have any idea right now.

SENATOR BEUTLER: And, I once again, this is information as I understand that will be coming down at some point in time in the not too distant future.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you. One of the real frustrations I have, members, with this bill is that I think that we're probably tied that we have to do it and I don't like those things. Senator Beutler was very patient in Judiciary Committee but there is a lot of these sorts of things that are going to come back to you eventually because you're going to have noncustodial parents who are going to be manipulated and harassed. Some of them don't deserve it at all, some of them do probably deserve it, but the fact that the Department of Social Services is going to be placed in an almost impossible situation and so are a number of members of the court system and so are you as legislators and so are citizens because you're going to have people...
