PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Does anyone wish to speak to this motion? Seeing none, we will proceed to vote on the motion to advance LB 715A. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 715A.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 715A is advanced. Do you have items on the desk, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I do, Madam President. Senator Withem has amendments to be printed to LB 852; Senator Conway to LB 579; Senator Lindsay to LB 457. That's all that I have. (See pages 1660-66 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Proceed with General File. LB 186.

CLERK: LB 186, Madam President, was a bill introduced by Senators Lindsay, Schimek, Will, Abboud, Rasmussen, and Pirsch. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 11, referred to Judiciary, advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Judiciary Committee. Senator...Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President, members. The committee amendments, adopted by the Judiciary Committee, would strike the original sections, insert new provisions, and for the purpose of clarifying and getting to the intent that was originally...should have originally been in the bill. The...and I think it would be best, probably, to just explain the bill while I talk about the committee amendments, that we know what the committee amendments will do. The bill is designed to provide notification to victims of crime, specifically upon release from custody of the individual who perpetrated the crime. The committee amendments clarify who makes that notification, whether that be the Department of Corrections, or the Board of Parole. It's an amendment that was brought to us and reviewed by both the Board of Parole and the Department of Corrections, and they concur, or they believe that it will clarify what their responsibilities are and
