

could do that is having a job training program that wasn't a job training program, it was a sham. And this language comes from the job support program that we now have in place at the state level. And so there...when I go through this, there is some understanding of what this terminology means, and would help us clarify that we talk about substantial job training programs, not sham training programs. And I would move for the adoption of the amendment to clarify that.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Wesely. We'll now vote on the Wesely amendment to LB 227. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted?

SPEAKER BAACK PRESIDING

SPEAKER BAACK: Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any discussion on the advancement of the bill? Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Just briefly, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. I have not, in the past, supported this type of legislation, though I would be the first one to say, in talking with Senator Wesely, and briefly hearing Senator Abboud, that Senator Abboud has brought a much better, more acceptable bill to the body. And I appreciate Senator Abboud's work on that line. I still have some deep concerns, however, after the job training, after the vocational skills and after the three months period, that we're still not, after that point, still saying that there can...I think we still have a potential there for abuse. And I'm a little uncertain, at this point, whether I want to continue to support it. I think what I'll do is support moving it to Select File, because I think in good faith Senator Abboud has brought something that we sent a message on the job service, on the training, and they've worked with it and come back with a counter offer. But I would like to, between that time and Select File, work with Senator Abboud and Senator
