A lot of other people have done a lot of work on this too. This is a culmination of a lot of years of dealing with this problem and I would encourage you to support Senator Rasmussen's amendment and also to advance the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Withem. Further discussion. Seeing none, Senator Rasmussen, do you wish to close on your amendment? Waives closing.
