

as well. And it's available for projects across the state. It's available for Scottsbluff monument, it's available for Fort Robinson area, it's available for the Platte River area, it's available for the Missouri River area all across this state, whoever has a project that will work. It is also limited in the sense that the fund is not allowed to contribute more than 50 percent of any particular project, so there has to be a substantial commitment on the part of private entities or on the part of local public entities in order to get, to obtain funds from the trails fund. The bill has a ten year sunset on it so it would go out for ten years. Beyond that the Legislature would be making another decision as to whether what had been accomplished with the fund was worthwhile or was not worthwhile. And the bill basically leaves to Game and Parks Commission the ability to make rules and regulations with regard to how they will allocate funds and the criteria they will use in choosing among projects. That is basically what the bill does, Mr. Speaker. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Motion on the bill, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely would move to indefinitely postpone LB 714. Senator Beutler as the introducer has the option to lay the bill over, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, I choose to lay it over.

SPEAKER BAACK: It is laid over. We will also lay over LB 714A. We will go to LB 91.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 91 was a bill originally introduced by Senator Lynch and a number of members. (Title read.) The bill was introduced on January 10. It was referred to the Education Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending. Mr. President, I do have a priority motion, however. Senator Horgan would move to bracket LB 91 until Tuesday, April 23, 1991.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Horgan.

SENATOR HORGAN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members, LB 91 is Senator Lynch's bill. He is the primary sponsor. Senator Lynch
