

against whom an administrative order has been issued and is pending at this time. Is that your understanding, Senator Rod Johnson?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Yes.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Thank you very much. It is Senator Rod Johnson's understanding that...he agrees with me that this language does apply to those cases, such as Mrs. Jeanneret's, and that if the bill becomes law that persons in the position in which Mrs. Jeanneret finds herself would be covered by this statute. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schmit. I'll recognize Senator Warner, followed by Senator Rod Johnson, and Senator Morrissey. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, Senator Johnson, you and I were starting to visit, and we didn't work out. I'm very willing to support this. What I did send...had just sent up, as you came back, was a unanimous consent motion to again bracket on E & R final to avoid the printing thing. It would not be my intention to hold it up, but I still have some concerns about the inspection and what ramification for damages it might have. And there may not be a problem, I'm not sure that there is. But then if we can also address this threshold of what the individual responsibility might be, and I don't know if that's feasible either, but if we could take a couple, three days to at least explore it, I would feel more comfortable. With that, since you're speaking next, I'm very willing to support the amendment as it is, and you can comment on your time.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Senator Rod Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Madam President, first of all, I appreciate the comments Senator Warner has presented. I'm not against any ideas or plans to make this bill better. I'm just concerned about the time line we're working on, and that seems to be the big concern, that's the reason I've asked the Speaker to special order this. But, you know, if we can make the bill better so that those who have the ability to pay do pay, and those who do not, we make certain accommodations to help them out, I'm all for that, if we can do that. I'm not sure how we address that
