

enough about it, right off the top of my head. But there are certain political subdivisions, as you know, who have the right to eminent domain, including NRDs, and it doesn't matter whether it is railroad property or other kinds of property, they have the right to use eminent domain. And they have that right with regard to conservation projects or recreational projects or anything within the purvey of their jurisdiction.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: All right, thank you. If then...well, you referred to that in Section 6 and that is what caught my eye, but I believe I understand. If this was in statute, there could be some encouragement to consider eminent domain for such a proposed recreational trail, and it would be well within the present statute. I mean, I think I am clear on that. So I think I'd still support Senator Coordsen's amendment but I am concerned that we might be expanding on the present use of eminent domain, and I am not an expert in that area so I will delay my approach but I would support Coordsen's amendment. I am, I guess, philosophically opposed to expansion of eminent domain for this kind of purpose. So, with that, I will end.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Wesely. The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do see five hands. We will now proceed to vote on ceasing debate. All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR COORDSEN: I would like to move the advancement of the amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: It is getting late in the day, a call of the house and a roll call vote, move on.

SPEAKER BAACK: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.
