without robbing of its money for any other programs that it was originally intended. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Elmer. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Am I closing, or are there other speakers?

PRESIDENT MOUL: There are no other speakers at this point.

SENATOR LAMB: Then this will be my closing. Thank you, Madam Chair, members, it's not quite true that the tiers take care of this situation. If you have a small school in York County or Seward County that is five miles or ten miles down the road from the farthest student or the next school and you have the same sized school out in Cherry County where the distances are much, much greater, you have a difference. It's not, as Senator Withem has mentioned and Senator Moore has mentioned, it's not taken into consideration under the tier system. The size of the school certainly is, yes. But not the special circumstance that we have in regard to sparsity. You know when you're in a more populous area such as Seward County or York County or a piece of Polk County I believe it is, you have a situation there where you might have a small school and you're in the same tier with a small school out in Cherry County, but the situation from then on is very much different. And so that is why this is justified, that's why this is justified. It's not taken care of in the tier system. Now as I mentioned before, the Education Committee adopted this amendment. The Education Committee adopted the amendment and so I guess I'd submit it certainly has some validity with that august group having adopted the amendment. So all I'm trying to do is do the same thing here. It's not a big shift. It's a small, it's a very small shift, but it is significant for those school which are negatively impacted by the fact that there is a long distance between people out there. So I hope that you would adopt this amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lamb. We will now vote on the Lamb amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Lamb.
