

PRESIDENT MOUL: We've had a request for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. All senators please return to your desks and record your presence. All unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. Please record your presence. Would the following senators please check in: Senator Conway, Senator Cudaback, Senator Landis, Senator Lynch, Senator Byars, Senator Robak and Senator Wehrbein. Still looking for Senator Byars. Senator Robak, would you please check in. We will proceed with the roll call vote on the Lamb amendment to the committee amendments.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1755 of the Legislative Journal.) 11 ayes, 29 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The Lamb amendment fails. Are there any further amendments on the desk? I will raise the call.

CLERK: Senator Dierks would move to amend the committee amendments, Madam President. (Dierks amendment appears on page 1756 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR DIERKS: Madam President, members of the body, my amendment is an amendment to the amendment that Senator Lynch had early on today that we deliberated over the noon hour I guess, or thought about over the noon hour. The amendment is, if you would look at your bill book on page, or your Legislative Journal on page 1723, line 17, at the end of subsection (2)(a) which would be line, the second line 2 on that page and where it says "administrator to the nearest one-tenth.", strike the period and put in "comma, except that one administrator shared by two or more school districts may be employed full-time regardless of the combined average daily membership of the school districts." We have a number of school districts in the state that utilize two administrators, or one administrator for two school districts and I think that the way that Senator Lynch's first amendment was drafted, that we need this to clarify the fact that they can continue to do that. I think it's as simple as that. Are there any questions?
