number of years and it simply allows them to take the choice to go to the school of their choice and not to pay the tuition that other students who don't live in the district or in the OPS school boundaries are afforded, and so it's somewhat of an equity issue in allowing these students who have gone to District 66 schools for a number of years to participate in that educational opportunity that are available there and they're at a disadvantage simply because they live within the OPS school boundaries and had they lived in a different school district which was not under desegregation, their home district would allow them to transfer under option. And with that, I would ask the members to support the amendment. Thank you.
