

anybody else to ever play those cards, and it was their lucky cards, and they had memorized all the numbers. So it is a serious thing with the elderly, not only in Omaha, but all across the state. And please keep in mind that we are educating our children in some of these private schools. We do not get a tuition tax credit, we do not get any help whatsoever from the state, so we depend on the enjoyment of the elderly, and maybe in some cases some young people that do go to the bingo games and sit and relax in the afternoon, or in the evening. And if they want to play on the cards that they know the numbers, rather than the disposable cards, I don't think we should deny them that. So I urge you to adopt the amendment to LB 427.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard Senator Labeledz's closing. We will now proceed to vote on the amendment offered by Senator Labeledz. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President...Mr. President, on adoption Senator Labeledz's amendment. Excuse me.

SPEAKER BAACK: Yes, Mr. Clerk. The amendment is adopted. Next item on the bill.

CLERK: Senator Johnson would move to amend. Senator Johnson's amendment is on page 1385, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Lowell Johnson.

SENATOR L. JOHNSON: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature. My amendment was printed on page 1385 of the Journal, and also was circulated to the membership on the floor, a week ago today, which had a copy of the amendment and also an explanation attached to it. AM0823 is essentially identical to my LB 99, which I introduced this session, and includes the committee amendments to that bill. LB 99 was reported by the General Affairs Committee with six affirmative votes, and none dissenting. The terms of LB 99, now incorporated in this amendment, would allow the Eastern Nebraska Chapter of the National Railway Historical Society, which is the nonprofit organization operating the Fremont and Elkhorn Valley Rail Road, in Dodge County, to conduct bingo aboard its excursion and/or dinner train operation. My amendment accomplishes this through redefinition of the term "premises", under Section 9-216 of the Nebraska Bingo Act. Other than including an excursion or dinner
