SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, this is an amendment that we put this section in...I think that this is the Department of Revenue bill. LB 773 is a Department of Revenue bill, kind of a clean-up bill, and this amendment was put in on General File and it was sought to help the printers instate. It turns out they are not sure now, and so what the Department of Revenue would like to do is simply delete this language and study, the Department of Revenue and all the interested parties study this issue this summer so we can come up with a better solution, and bring something back next year. And so that is simply the amendment. It deletes some language dealing with other consumption and so it is an issue that the Department of Revenue wants to study over the summer. So with that, I would ask for the adoption of this amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion on the Hartnett amendment, Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, believe it or not, I am supporting the Hartnett amendment on LB 773. I agree with the Department of Revenue's interpretation, and I would hope that you would join me. Thank you.
