I would urge adoption of the amendment. It will go a long way toward, I think, establishing what needs to be a better working relationship amongst the various educational opportunities. Thank you, Madam Chair.

SENATOR HALL: Could I ask for a call of the house and then a roll call vote, please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Motion has been made to place the house under call. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would the senators all please return to their seats and please record your presence. We're looking for Senator Lamb. Would the following senators please check in. Senator Beutler, Senator Chambers, Senator Rasmussen, Senator Schmit, Senator Warner, please check in, and Senator Lamb. We will proceed with roll call vote on the Hall amendment. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1799 of the Legislative Journal.) 24 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment fails. I will raise the call.
