CLERK: Senator Beutler, I now have your second amendment, Senator, page 1762 of the Journal.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, this is AM, Mr. Clerk, AM1181?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, colleagues, this amendment has been passed out to you and the necessity for this amendment was occasioned by an amendment that was put on on General File and the amendment is just a step above technical. What we did on General File, you may recall that the bankers wanted a transitional license, that is a license that would be effective while people were meeting certain additional requirements that were being imposed by the federal government during the brief period of time. And so that was put in, the provision for the transitional license was included. But when we did that, we did not provide for the fees that would pertain to the provisional license such as the transitional license. And all this amendment does is provide that with regard to the transitional license application fee, it sets out what the fees will be and those fees are exactly the same as the fees for the regular license. No distinction was made basically because the transitional license, while it's in effect, will empower them to do the same thing that a regular license would, so it's like a regular license but it's only available during a certain time period while they are meeting the requirements. That's the total effect of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any discussion on the amendment offered by Senator Beutler? Seeing none, do you wish to close, Senator Beutler? Waives closing. We will now proceed to vote on the amendment offered by Senator Beutler. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The Beutler amendment is adopted. Next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schmit would move to amend. Senator, I have AM1445 in front of me.
