

**SPEAKER BAACK:** The house is under call. All members please report to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. Senator Dierks.

**SENATOR DIERKS:** I'd request we do a roll call in regular order, please.

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Roll call vote in regular order has been requested. Senator Nelson, would you record your presence, please. We're looking for Senator Bernard-Stevens, Senator Robinson, and Senator Hartnett. We are looking for Senator Robinson. Senator Dierks, can we proceed with the roll call? Roll call in regular order. Mr. Clerk.

**CLERK:** (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1828-29 of the Legislative Journal.) 17 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on the adjournment.

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Motion fails. The call is raised.

**CLERK:** Mr. President, I have a priority motion. Senator Morrissey would move to bracket LB 827 until Wednesday, May 1, 1991.

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Senator Morrissey.

**SENATOR MORRISSEY:** Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. Quite honestly, here's what's going on, LB 827 attempts to do a few things that are good for the citizens, that need to be done, get the monitoring committee up and running, get them funded, and address some language on some site language. The rest of it is not needed. Not only is it not needed, it is bad for your constituents, it's bad, three or four issues that are just plumb bad, folks. So Cap and I, Senator Dierks and I need some time to get together to get the language implemented that needs to be done, and only that language. Help the monitoring committees, help the citizen oversight, which is the only oversight that has taken place thus far, get back up and running, let it run like it has, like it worked in Nemaha County, worked well. They had a lawyer who allowed for...or brought their concerns to us and helped us draft legislation, much needed legislation. This present language will restrict their ability to do that and other things. Give Senator Dierks and I the time we need to do exactly what is needed and nothing more. There are things in 827 that are very, very bad for the citizens of this state, and
