I could go on about some of the other things in here, but I'm out of time. The direct appeal is good for US Ecology when they need it, when they need to drag it out, like if we need to shut their facility down, then we don't have direct appeal, then we go through the Administrative Procedures Act. Now who wrote that, and whose it good for? Give us the time to get this fixed.

SPEAKER BAACK: Time. You've heard the closing on the motion to bracket LB 827 until May 1st. We will now vote on that motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk. Record vote has been requested.
