

SENATOR SMITH: Okay, I see what you're saying.

SENATOR SMITH: If she's under age, that raises another question in my mind then. And maybe I should be aware of this, but I'm not, but maybe you can tell me. All right, let's say that the young girl, just going back to the bill then now cause you've raised this question,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR SMITH: ...and she goes to the abortionist, not knowing even of these other provisions here, she hasn't been informed.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR SMITH: She goes to the abortionist, she's not willing to testify that any of these things occurred to her. She's not able to get the abortion, is she, unless she wants to go to an illegal abortionist?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right.

SENATOR SMITH: He decides to do it illegally.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right, he could not give an abortion without getting...facing liability, unless the conditions of...
