SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Will, would you support the informed consent bill as introduced by Senator Lindsay?

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Will.

SENATOR LABEDZ: As an attachment or an amendment to LB 425?

SENATOR WILL: Senator Labedz, I am not a member of the Judiciary Committee and I am not familiar with the specifics of the bill, but I'd certainly be willing to take a look at it.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you., If this amendment does become a part of LB 425, I certainly will introduce an amendment to attach Senator Lindsay's bill because I believe a pregnant woman, if she has a right to know exactly what the law is, then she should also have the right to know the development of the stage of her pregnancy and all information necessary, and I think that the bill that Senator Lindsay did introduce, and I am sorry he is not going to be here the rest of the afternoon because he could explain further why his part of the LB 425, the informed consent, would also be another point of information for the pregnant girl, and it is the right to know exactly depending on the stage of her pregnancy as to the development of the child, and I certainly will introduce that amendment if this amendment is attached. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Labedz. Senator Schmit. Senator Crosby, did you wish to address the Smith amendment? Anyone else wishing to speak to the Smith amendment to the Chambers amendment? Seeing no one, Senator Smith, did you wish to close, please?

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Just briefly, I would want to just reiterate that where I am coming from may be a different perspective than some of the people on this floor, maybe coming from...and, Senator Labedz, I agree with you totally. I think that if we think it is important that this young girl, and speaking with a school nurse or a counselor, needs to be informed of the provisions of the bill, and, you know, the consequences, et cetera, I think you are right, that we should also, she should at that point in time, if not before, and certainly a nurse should be appropriate to tell her about
