

won't try to say what your real motive is, but I think it goes much deeper than just the liability, that there are other ethical considerations that might move you. Senator Labeledz, I have a question for you, and this question is going to be based on the existing language in the law. When we talk about abuse or neglect, sexual abuse and so forth, let me read from page 5 of the existing bill. The pregnant woman declares that she is a victim of abuse as defined in Section 28-351, what is that definition?

SENATOR LABEDZ: You said it wasn't going to be a trick question.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I am just asking what the language of your bill means, and I am just...okay...

SENATOR LABEDZ: State your question again.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, the pregnant woman declares that she is a victim of abuse as defined in Section 28-351.

SENATOR LABEDZ: That is, evidently, either physical or sexual abuse, I don't have it in front of me.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, sexual abuse then is next, as defined in Section 28-367. How is that sexual abuse defined?

SENATOR LABEDZ: You have it in front of you, why don't you state it?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, it doesn't give a definition of it in the bill.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Oh, you mean in LB 425?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. This is all that it...what I am giving you is all that is in the bill, so I am asking you what does it mean. If you turn to page 5...

SENATOR LABEDZ: Okay, I have got it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, now do you see starting in line 17, the pregnant woman declares that she is a victim of abuse as defined in Section 28-351, but it doesn't tell us what that is, do you know what that definition would be from reading this?
