SENATOR HABERMAN: But it still gives the authorization for private contributions, that's what you're saying.

SENATOR WARNER: That the body of 714 itself would authorize that, and what would be left in 714, for '91-92, would be the approval of the expenditure, if they do have any gifts or bequests.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you, Senator Warner. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Warner, did you wish to speak further on this? Anyone else wishing to speak to the motion to indefinitely postpone? Seeing no one, Senator Wehrbein, did you wish to close?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, I would, please, Mr. Speaker. I'd just like to have you consider a few minutes, as I close on this, some of the things that I talked about during the debate on this, a week or ten days ago. I'm not denying that the idea of a trail is important. And I'm not particularly opposing trails in particular, in fact, I probably can support 714. My dilemma is that I think we're taking some money from state funds that is unnecessary to do. Senator Beutler handed out state funding mechanisms for trails, in a previous handout. And there are many other ways to support this type of endeavor, and I think are much more appropriate. Motor vehicle fuel tax, vehicle registration, bond issues, user fees, lotteries, a direct tax checkoff, or a document tax in Arizona, some of these are proposed, some of these are in place. My point is that there are other ways to do this, particularly user fees, and I think that's appropriate, I might even use those myself some day. But my point is it's not necessary to spend General Funds at this particular stage. I made a quick note here of what \$100,000 may buy. It could use...it could fund three college professors, at least initially, at many of our colleges. It could provide two committee counsels for state agencies, some of which are desperately needed in the Department of Economic...or Department of Environmental Control, or some such agency. It could provide needed health to mental...needed aid to mental health, to mental retardation regions. Many other areas this \$100,000 could be well spent, and legitimately so, in my opinion, using state funds. So it isn't that we...that I deny the need for these,
