

development, repairing bridges would be development. I'm not sure what distinction you are interested in, but I think what you're saying is correct.

SENATOR NELSON: What I'm interested in is so that we're not just exactly too open-ended. And that habitat stamp, that...that is a voluntary, anyhow, whoever...and I do agree with Senator Moore, bicycle trails are as important as any other point of recreation, whatever we think. But my main question was, is if it had been cleaned and the rails, and the ties, and the salvage value, and that was my main question. Development, I know, is a wide open question. It could contain a lot of things. Thanks.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Nelson. Senator Wesely. Yours is the last light on, so that won't be necessary. Senator Beutler, do you wish to close on your amendment?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I hope this amendment can be seen as a compromise amendment of sorts, in the sense that it's recognition, on my part, that I, too, would like to move more in the direction of user fees and user specific kinds of funds, along with General Funds. I don't believe in doing away with General Funds entirely, either. But I do believe that what people have been saying about other forms of funding is important. And, if you believe in that, then I think you have to recognize that the Habitat Fund is certainly logical candidate, number one, for making a contribution to this kind of trail, because habitat, in the experience of other states around the nation, is something that is a part of a recreational trail. And I think this amendment moves us in the direction that we all want to go. Again, I would point out that this doesn't force the spending of any funds, it simply enables Game and Parks to spend a bit of habitat money for that purpose, should they see an appropriate opportunity. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard Senator Beutler's closing. We will now proceed to vote on the amendment by Senator Beutler. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the amendment by Senator Beutler. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment.
