CLERK: Senator Haberman would move to amend the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Haberman. Senator Haberman, on your amendment. It is withdrawn. It is withdrawn.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: We are now to the advancement of LB 714A, as amended. Is there any discussion? Senator Beutler, do you wish to close?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I think this has been fully and fairly debated. I would remind you that the trails bill itself, 714, is on Select File, and we're merely moving up 714A to catch up with it, right Senator Lamb? But this is very important, and we've reached a compromise. I hope it's a compromise that you can vote for today, and I hope it's a compromise that when you think about it will seem reasonable to you on Select, and on Final Reading, and we can move ahead on this bill without too much further controversy. Would ask that the bill be moved.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard Senator Beutler's closing on the advancement of LB 714A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. A record vote has been requested. Have you all voted? A record vote has been requested. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 1866 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 12 nays on the advancement of 714A.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 714A advances. Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, thank you. Education Committee gives notice of confirmation hearing. Your Enrolling Clerk has presented to the Governor bills read on Final Reading this morning. (Re. LB 123, LB 528, LB 583, LB 742.) Amendments to be printed to LB 718 by Senator Johnson; Senator Schellpeper to LB 355; and to LB 503. That's all that I have, Mr. President.
