

are those who feel like this will have a positive impact upon their community or their area, and we need to consider that aspect as much as we consider the negative side, which is also being presented here today, and I think that is relevant to the debate. So, again, I would say that if you want to do another study, you want to spend additional money for three site studies, you can do it. It isn't going to ruin the bill, obviously, but I am not sure what conclusions you can draw from them once they are done. It is just like the voting on the community consent. Nobody wants community consent unless they make sure they have the boundaries drawn so that the conclusion that comes out of it is already prearranged. I can draw you a line on community consent that will give you a yes vote, and I can draw you one that will give you a no vote. The same situation here, you want to design the study so you get the results that you hope that you want to show that it is either negative or positive for your area. I don't call that fair, but I am hoping that we will avoid doing that here today, and that we will reject this amendment and move on to Senator Morrissey's next amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Rod Johnson. Next is Senator Crosby.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. I want to speak today, I was going to speak Thursday, I guess it was we were here, Spencer, and didn't get an opportunity because we adjourned. I just have a couple of things to say about the issue in general, because I think there is a lot of us here, you think that there is no interest. I think there is interest but, perhaps, because, as you say, it isn't in our backyard, we are not as concerned, perhaps, that of the effects that it might have on the people that live in Spencer and in Boyd County and in Butte and so on. When I ran in 1988, one of the things I did was go to Lincoln Electric Service, at the invitation of a young woman there, who is a PR person, and watched a film, which was put together, it was factual, to show the way that a site like this would be built for the waste to be taken to it, and given a lot of reasons and definitions of low-level waste were given to us for me to und...and it helped me a lot to...before that I didn't even know what low-level waste was, I will have to confess. You know, you hear these terms but you don't always know exactly what is involved. It was very informative and educational for me because I at least found out why there was a controversy and it seemed very reasonable. The way they
