

Well, come to find out later on that they don't do that because they don't classify the waste until they ship it. So they do take...if they classified it now, it would be Class C waste and dilute it within their material down to a lower level, B or C. But they didn't lie to me because they don't do that, they don't reclassi...take Class C waste and dilute it down to Class A waste because they don't classify it A, B, or C until they ship it. So they dilute it before they classify it so they can claim that they never do that. Now this was told to me during this whole process. Now that didn't make me real comfortable with the power companies credibility, and how up front they were being on this issue. Another fear of the known is in the handout I gave you the other day. Low-level waste and our friend, the atom, films, I have seen them since I was a kid. Our friend, the atom, low-level, you can lay in it, you can eat it, it won't hurt you. That handout I had the other day talked about the military, a spill on a military base, the NRC Commission talked about a licensee transferred some, I believe it is, americium, something to that effect, a highly toxic, potentially hazardous carcinogen, which is low-level waste. Now that is not fear of the unknown, that is fear of the known. That is low-level waste. It is highly toxic. It is a potential carcinogen. That is not unknown. That is known. Now my friend, the atom, when he comes in the form of that particular material is not that good a buddy to me. And I know that, and these people know that. So it is not fear of the unknown all the time, but fear of the unknown is real. Once it is there, it is a very real fear, and you need to study it and look at it. You don't ignore it. You don't ignore it. If an article comes out in the paper tomorrow and says all the farmers in Nebraska are getting rich, that is a fact until you can prove it wrong. That is a fact, whether it is right or wrong. The same with this nuclear fear, some of it is justified, some of it isn't, but it is a very real fact. You have destroyed these people's lives. If you site it there, they will be moving out, the people that are completely uncomfortable with the facility. They will have no choice. If you put a computer factory in next to my house in the country, I am not going to be happy, but I probably won't move out. But you put a low-level waste facility next to my house in the country, and what if you all lived in the country, if they put it right across the road from your house, would you stay there or would you move? It is real, perceived or factual, it is real to these people and I am simply asking you to study it as the federal reqs call for, not the bogus study that all the national experts have reviewed and said
