PRESIDENT MOUL: Time.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: ...they've had all along.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Morrissey. I will now recognize Senator Dierks, followed by Senator Kristensen. Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Madam President and members of the body, I think that quite possibly Senator Johnson must have had a little change of heart, evidently he is willing to discuss the Supreme Court access situation, and I am happy for the people I represent on that score. I think that we have to be very careful when we are dealing with this amendment because...or not the amendment we are talking about now, but the one we are trying to amend with this amendment, that that amendment evidently was pretty well crafted by the US Ecology lobby, and they are the ones who are calling the shots on this. It is unfortunate that that sort of thing happens, but I guess we all know that it does. So I'd just like to ask for your support of Senator Morrissey's amendment, which has a great bearing on the people in Boyd County and does provide exactly what we need, the bare minimums. It does the monitoring committee thing, which it is essential that we have happen, and it also helps with the Supreme Court thing. So I just would wish that you would accept this amendment. We can be on our way if you do this. I don't believe Senator Morrissey has any further designs on the bill, at least I haven't checked with him on that, but I think that is true. So I would ask that you support this amendment and pass it on then. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Dierks. Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I'd call the question, please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Kristensen, there is only Senator Morrissey left to speak, if he would do closing now. He doesn't want to. Okay. We have sufficient seconds for calling the question. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. And we have had a request for a call of the house. All those in favor of the request for a call of the house please vote aye, opposed nay.
