SENATOR R. JOHNSON: I have a question for Senator Morrissey.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Morrissey, would you respond, please.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yes.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Senator Morrissey, I'm sorry. I was talking with Senator Peterson. This is the amendment dealing with quarterly reports?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: AM...now, Mr. Clerk, AM1333 is what we're on now?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yes, yes.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Okay. Senator Morrissey said that I said, the other day, that I would support one of these four amendments. And that was, of course, contingent upon he wouldn't run any more amendments. But...just kidding, Senator. I am supporting this amendment. I, as I said before, I am for accountability, and I think that that's what has been necessary and needed in this process, to begin with. So I have no problem with this amendment, and would like to see it adopted.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any further discussion on the amendment by Senator Morrissey? Seeing none, Senator Morrissey, do you wish to close on this amendment?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: I would waive closing.

SPEAKER BAACK: We will now proceed to vote on the amendment by Senator Morrissey. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Morrissey's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. The next item on the bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is by Senators Johnson and Dierks. Senator, I have AM1214, we printed it separately.
