SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yes, Madam President and members, I'd like to thank all of you who may or may not vote against this for allowing me to answer all your questions on why this is bad or good. Yes, I'm being sarcastic, very much so. You know...I have no choice. I can't win anyway on these issues, I have and I've been soundly thrashed all afternoon. I'm reinstating it in the bill on page 3, line 21, and then again on page 12, line 17. It's...we're reinstating basically stricken language, language that was already in there, already worked well in some areas. All I can say it allows the community, the monitoring committee to what the intent was. If you want to have a monitoring committee, you'd better allow them to do this. If you want to hope that this body will react in the future when it comes to your county, should this site fail, good luck. Help yourself right now just in case, folks, because it cannot hurt the process now. Just in case this site fails and they come sniffing around your county, adopt this now, adopt it now, because if you don't, you and I will be working here in about two or three years trying to get it adopted then and you'll have about as much luck as I'm having today. Thank you.
