

SENATOR WESELY: Took your language.

SENATOR MOORE: You're doing what I...and I thank you for that...(interruption)

SENATOR WESELY: We're doing what you told us to.

SENATOR MOORE: The question on what we meant there, we're making it clear what we meant, we passed the legislation a long time ago.

SENATOR WESELY: Yep.

SENATOR MOORE: Okay, thank you very much, Senator Wesely.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Moore. Mr. Clerk, do you have amendments on the desk?

CLERK: Madam President, I do. Senator Wesely would move, Senator Wesely and Rasmussen would move to amend. The amendment is on page 1887 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Madam President. This amendment from Senator Rasmussen and myself clarifies a number of things brought to us by the Department of Social Services. It does indicate...let me see here, oh, yeah, one of the concerns was the cost and difficulty in inspecting a new day care home within 30 days and so this changes it to 60 days, so within two months they would be inspected instead of one month. And we also change from the annual inspection to a biennial inspection but we do indicate that if there's adequate resources we'd like to see it done annually but at least on a biennial basis so it does ease up the cost and the restrictions involved in the inspection program. We do also change the grant program that's in the bill, would be currently under the bill administered by the Women's Commission, we change it to the Department of Social Services to have better coordination of the department. Then also the department and the Department of Education, Department of Social Services and Department of Education would collaborate Child Care and Early Childhood Education to make it clear that the Department of Education, a division that we set up would have to work with and cooperate with the Department of Social
