

Services and vice versa instead of having them not collaborate. So that is the major changes. It's mostly clean-up and we do ease up on the requirements for inspection.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Are there any senators who wish to speak to this amendment? Senator Rasmussen. Senator Wickersham, do you wish to speak to this amendment? Senator Lamb. Okay, I don't see anyone. We'll proceed to vote on the Wesely amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? We are voting on the Wesely amendment to LB 836. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. Do you have a further amendment?

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Warner would move to amend the bill. (Warner amendment appears on page 1901 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, the amendment I am offering strikes Section 30 of the bill. If you look on page 28 of the bill, Section 30, deals with the property that is exempt from personal property tax and the bill as drafted would add to the current exemptions, materials, supplies, equipment used by a person licensed to provide these services as well as Section 9, that those should be exempt and I suspect we should not be adding to the list of exemptions in this fashion. I'm not sure what kind of an issue of classification that might create in some future court decision or maybe it's covered under business equipment. In any event if that becomes what the Legislature eventually does and then would be exempt, but I think it would be well to take it out of this bill and treat all the exemption of property in whatever fashion it is going to be treated at one time, and that is all the amendment does.
