SENATOR WESELY: That's in part correct, yes.

SENATOR PIRSCH: With the other part.

SENATOR WESELY: Well, I tried to do this last year regardless of federal funding so I'd like to do it anyway, but it does set up the mechanism to deal with the federal funding, yes.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay. And I appreciate this summary that you passed out and I have questions on three of the points. When we talk about day care homes could not be regulated by local zoning authorities, are we talking about the big day care establishments, are we talking about the homes with less than four children, what are we talking about?

SENATOR WESELY: Family day care homes, not the day care centers, but the homes and those would be in home, less than eight children.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Less than eight children.

SENATOR WESELY: Yeah.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay.

SENATOR WESELY: It would be four to eight children would be licensed in a family day care home.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Would be the licensed and not subject to any zoning authorities.

SENATOR WESELY: That's right.

SENATOR PIRSCH: And of course, that would be all ages too then, would that not?

SENATOR WESELY: Well, we were talking about children under eight by and large when we talk about day care homes.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay. I just wondered if it limited that though to that specific..
