SPEAKER BAACK: Record, Mr. Clerk.

SENATOR MOORE: This is the third bill on the sheet, request 1271, which raises the per diem rate for the judges in the Commission on Industrial Relations, from 180 to 250 dollars per day.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I have a question, Mr. President, members of the body, a question of Senator Moore, please.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Yes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Moore, when are we actually going to physically get our hands on LB 652, the trailer bill?

SENATOR MOORE: The trailer bill, well the bill was introduced as...the amended...the amended bill was just introduced, right now. So I don't know when the printer will have that ready, I don't know. Tomorrow, in the complete budget book, you'll get that tomorrow.

SENATOR HABERMAN: We will get 652, the trailer bill, as amended, tomorrow?

SENATOR MOORE: I guess I couldn't tell you when it will be printed. I mean it was introduced, and I can get you a copy of it, I guess. But I'm not sure what their timing is, downstairs, for getting it printed.
