SENATOR MOORE: Mr. Speaker, maybe in the interest of time, since one additional vote is necessary to make this happen, and I don't...I may have to ask for a call of the house to get the one additional vote.

SPEAKER BAACK: Am I to consider that a request?

SENATOR MOORE: Request a call of the house. I'm not...

SPEAKER BAACK: We have a request for the house to go under call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under call. And call in votes have been authorized.

CLERK: Senator Chizek voting yes.

SPEAKER BAACK: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 1 nay on the introduction, Mr. President. Mr. President, new bill, LB 857, introduced by the Appropriations Committee. (Read by title for the first time. See page 1913 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: I'm going to leave us under call for a few minutes, because we do have another bill...another motion that's going to require 30 votes.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Moore, as Chair of Appropriations, would move to suspend Rule 3, Sections 4(e), and 13 and Rule 6, Sections 1 and 2, and place LBs 854, LB 855, LB 856, and LB 857 on General File.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Yes, Mr. Speaker. This is the issue that Senator Withem brought up before. This is the actual motion that would waive the committee hearing rule for these four bills and place them directly on General File. The rationale being that, one, obviously the time constraints, but also the issue
