SPEAKER BAACK: LB 830 advances. We'll go to LB 830A.

CLERK: LB 830 introduced by Senator Wesely. (Read title.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. The A bill is for like \$65,000, I believe. It's to fund the provisions of the bill. I would move for the advancement of the A bill

SPEAKER BAACK: Any discussion on the advancement of LB 830A? Seeing none, Senator Wesely, do you wish to close? We will now proceed to vote on the advancement of LB 830A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the advancement of 830 (sic), Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 830A advances. We will now proceed to LR 24CA.

CLERK: LR 24CA was introduced by Senators Baack and Smith at the request of the Governor. It would propose an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Nebraska by amending Article III, Section 24. The resolution was referred to General Affairs for public hearing. It was advanced to General File. I do have amendments pending.
