

SENATOR COORDSEN: It certainly is, Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Looking for it, I couldn't find it, but...okay. Well, giving the uncertainty of the price tag of this bill, I guess I have a little concern about this amendment and would encourage the body to allow Senator Coordsen some more time to firm up the figures on it before we support him in this endeavor even though I think what he is saying probably does make sense. At this time I'd have to vote no on the amendment though.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Moore. Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. I rise to echo the sentiments of Senator Hall and Senator Moore. I agree that Senator Coordsen has brought an issue to it that I suspect has a good deal of merit. I think, however, that it's probably we need to have a legislative bill that contains it, to have the fiscal analyst to take a look at it, tell us exactly what the cost would be. I would certainly not be opposed to taking a hard look at it and probably supporting it maybe next year as a member of the Revenue Committee, but I think at this point on Select File, this late in the session with the uncertainties that Senator Moore has pointed out, it probably would behoove us not to adopt this amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Will. Any further discussion on the amendment by Senator Coordsen? Seeing none, Senator Coordsen, do you wish to close?

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, just quite briefly, see if I can come up with about 10 minutes of closing here which seems to be appropriate for the issue this morning. I do not really consider the fiscal impact, if there is any, to be of an issue in this particular matter because if we're collecting a tax that should not have been collected for 24 years, it's a matter of being right, true, just and fair. Given the opportunity to have had a bill drafted in this, I certainly would have. This has got to be a critical issue this morning, one that is unknown to me because I'm one of those people that tend to buy a four-year-old vehicle from somebody or the other and then drive it till it completely disintegrates so I'm not very familiar with selling cars to anyone except the salvage yard, but it was brought to my attention. I bring it to the body for your consideration and encourage the adoption.
